This school year, many of you are seeking ways of developing and implementing co-requisite models to deliver developmental math education as mandated in HB 2223 by Fall 2018. Many sessions will be available for you at the TCCTA/TexMATYC sessions. In addition, we will have faculty share how they developed and implemented co-requisite models. Institutions have a three-year phase-in on the percentage of students enrolled. Below is a short summary of the three-year transition:

Academic Year	Percent of students enrolled
	in co-requisite model
2018-2019	25%
2019-2020	50%
2020-2021	75%

At the upcoming TCCTA/TexMATYC conference, we will have a couple of sessions dedicated to discussions surrounding the co-requisite model. Hope you can come share what you are doing at your campus. This will assist other institutions who are wanting to see how others are developing and implementing the co-requisite model.
